MODERN SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING STATEMENT

Soft Computer Consultant's Inc. d/b/a SCC Soft Computer ("SCC") on behalf of itself, and its direct or indirect subsidiaries ("SCC") is committed to social and environmental responsibility. As part of its commitment, SCC prohibits slavery and human trafficking in our operations and supply chain and works to minimize any associated risks. No matter the circumstances, SCC will not tolerate forced, bonded (including debt bondage) or indentured labor, involuntary prison labor, slavery, or trafficking of persons in any of our own business operations or by any SCC supplier, or for any other purpose. SCC considers each supplier's conduct and supplier's adherence to SCC's commitment to these principles when awarding and/or renewing business with any supplier.

This Statement is made pursuant to the requirements of the California Transparency in Supply Chains Act of 2010 and section 54(1) of the U.K. Modern Slavery Act 2015, and Part 2 of the Australian Modern Slavery Act 2018.

Gilbert Hakim signs this Statement as Chief Executive Officer and Chairman on behalf of SCC and its wholly owned subsidiaries, and in his capacity as Director or authorized representative of the above-named legal entities.

OUR BUSINESS

OUR MODERN SLAVERY POLICY AND DUE DILIGENCE

RISK PROFILE

SCC's business sector is generally considered to have a low risk of enabling slavery and human trafficking. We provide our products and services directly to customers, so our use of subcontractors who could have slavery or human trafficking in their supply chains is minimal.

TRAINING

SCC's staff are trained to follow company-wide reporting processes to report behavior that is abusive, discriminatory, illegal, or otherwise violates company policies.
